

Transitional Pastor Search Committee

SECOND UPDATE

Your Transitional Pastor Search Committee (TPSC) continues its work. We know some members are anxious about the process seeming to take a long period of time. There are several reasons leading us to where we currently are in the process:

Session was not allowed to form a search committee until after Mark's last day of work. Helene caused an interruption in our meetings. Beyond these external factors, you should know we have been meeting weekly. Our work began in understanding the process. We have recently spent two meetings in completing a nine-page document called the Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP). Although technically we were not required to complete this document, we were encouraged to do so by presbytery. It will help candidates to know more about Trinity as they decide their interest in serving us. We also believe this work will save Trinity's eventual permanent Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) time in their work in the future. The document was prepared with the assistance of Rev. Tom Phillips plus additional consultation with the Stated Clerk of our Presbytery.

The MDP was approved by Session on 12/9. Beyond what may come out of the posting, our committee has met to review the potential candidates we are aware of so far. Fortunately, all have experience as Transitional Pastors. Initial contacts have been made to gauge their interest before moving on to the next step which will be Zoom interviews. The MDP will be provided to candidates prior to any Zoom interview.

A big part of a Transitional Pastor's job is to prepare us to find the best new pastor. To that end, they will be leading us through a visioning process to help us discern our best path. This process will guide the PNC in their task. For these reasons (and more) the TP will be a very important person in the life of Trinity and will have a major role in guiding the way we move forward. We owe it to Trinity to do a thoughtful, prayerful, and thorough job in our search.

Despite the Walk's postponement followed by its cancellation this year, the financial result was a resounding success! Our board has reviewed all grant requests and decided we are able to increase our grants by \$12,500 to a total of \$120,000! We have also added a 12th agency grant for the Food Connection, which has been active in Buncombe County and is beginning their work in Henderson County.

Sponsor (think names on t-shirts) giving increased by \$8700--32%! For the last couple years, Trinity's Local Mission Ministry has supported the walk at the Angel level of \$1000. Your support of the folks who planned to walk totaled \$3503, short of our record \$3770, but a strong effort, considering all the Helene rescheduling, confusion, etc.

A big thank you to all who contributed to reducing hunger in Henderson County!
